### No Swatch, No Gauge Mittens

**DESIGNED BY JEAN GIFFORD** 



Intended for charity knitting. "Every pair will fit some child!"

#### **Materials**

Yarn and dpns to make a dense fabric of 4 to 6 sts per inch. The mittens pictured used the following yarns and needles:

- 1. Worsted-weight yarn, US5 ndls
- 2. Two strands of fingering-weight yarn held together, US4 ndls
- 3. 3-ply tapestry yarn, US6 ndls (with a simple knit and purl pattern stitch)
- 4. One strand fingering-weight, one strand sportweight held together, US5 ndls
- 5. Worsted-weight yarn, US 5 ndls
- 6. Heavy worsted-weight (Aran-weight) yarn, US6 ndls
- 7. 3-ply tapestry yarn, US6 ndls

**Quantity (approximate)**: Mitten #5 will use 140-155 yds of worsted-weight yarn to make a *pair* of mittens. Use your leftovers and scraps, allowing for this measurement.

Abbreviations: Dpns: double-pointed needles; Inc: increase K: knit; K2tog: knit 2 sts together; Kfb: knit into front & back of st (1 st increased) – may be substituted with any other inc; Ndls: needles; P: purl; PSSO: pass slipped stitch over knit stitch (1 st decreased) Sl 1: slip one st purl-wise (unless otherwise specified); Sts: stitches; [...] repeat enclosed instructions as specified.

#### **DIRECTIONS**

Note: Left and right mittens are knitted the same.

Cast on 36 stitches loosely. Divide onto 3 needles and join, being careful not to twist the stitches. Mark the beginning of the round.

#### Cuff

Work 22 rounds in ribbing. Either K1P1 ribbing or K2P2 ribbing is fine. Use your favorite.

#### **Shape Thumb Gusset**

Round 1: K1, P1, K3, P1; K to end of round.

Rounds 2 and 3: Repeat Round 1.

**Round 4:** K1, P1, kfb, K1, kfb, P1; K to end of round. —*38 sts* 

Rounds 5 and 6: K1, P1, K5, P1; K to end of round.

**Round 7:** K1, P1, kfb, K3, kfb, P1; K to end of round. —40 sts

Rounds 8 and 9: K1, P1, K7, P1; K to end of round.

**Round 10:** K1, P1, kfb, K5, kfb, P1; K to end of round. —42 sts

**Rounds 11 and 12:** K1, P1, K9, P1; K to end of round

**Round 13:** K1, P1, kfb, K7, kfb, P1; K to end of round. —44 sts

**Rounds 14 and 15:** K1, P1, K11, P1; K to end of round.

### **Save Out Stitches for Thumb**

**Round 16:** K2, place next 11 stitches on a holder; cast on 3 stitches; K to end of round.

#### Make the Hand

Work even on 36 sts for 22 rounds.

## **Shape Top of Hand**

**Round 1:** [Sl 1, K1, PSSO, K4] 6 times. — *30* sts

Rounds 2 and 3: Knit even.

**Round 4:** [Sl 1, K1, PSSO, K3] 6 times. — *24* sts

Round 5: Knit even.

**Round 6:** [SI 1, K1, PSSO, K2] 6 times. -18

sts

Round 7 Knit even.

Round 8: [SI 1, K1, PSSO, K1] 6 times. — 12

sts

**Round 9:** (SI1, K1, PSSO) 6 times. — 6 sts Break off yarn and thread the yarn through the remaining 6 sts. Draw yarn up tightly and fasten off.

# **Making the Thumb**

Attach yarn at top of thumb gusset to work the thumb. The thumb is worked in the round on 16 sts. Here is where those 16 sts come from: 11 stitches that you saved onto a holder, 1 st picked up between the holder and the cast-on sts at beginning of the hand, 3 sts picked up across the cast-on sts at beginning of the hand, 1 st picked up between the cast-on sts at beginning of the hand and the holder

Divide these stitches onto 3 needles.

Knit even for 11 rounds.

### **Shape Top of Thumb**

**Round 1:** [K2tog] 8 times. — 8 sts

Round 2: Knit even.

Round 3: [K2tog] 4 times. — 4 sts

Break off yarn and thread the yarn through the remaining 4 stitches. Draw yarn up tightly and fasten off. Weave in yarn ends. Steam lightly or block as necessary.

Make second mitten.

**Note:** For donation, please tie mittens together with a length of yarn or ribbon. Thanks!
