Sequence-Knit Scarves: Castro, Dogpatch, Tenderloin

Materials

<u>Yarn</u>

Noro Kureyon, or any worsted weight yarn, 200-220 yards in *each* of two colors (A, B)

Needles Size US 8 (5mm) needles

Gauge 4.5 stitches/inch in stockinette

Finished Dimensions

Castro: 7 x 68 inches (18 x 173 cm) Dogpatch: 6.5 x 68 inches (17 x 173 cm) Tenderloin: 7.75 x 68 inches (20 x 173 cm)

Abbreviations

K: knit; P: purl; S1WYF: Slip 1 purl-wise with the working yarn in front; St(s): stitch(es); [...] repeat enclosed instructions as specified.

PATTERN NOTES

To make a longer or wider scarf, add approximately 100-110 yards of each color. Always bring the new yarn from the front so the edge will look consistent.

DIRECTIONS

Referring to the desired pattern, cast on and work the setup row and one main row in color A. Change to color B and work two main rows. Continue alternating between A and B every two rows (working the main row for each color), until the piece is the desired length. Bind off. Weave in ends. **Blocking is highly recommended** to highlight the stitch pattern, especially for the Castro stitch pattern.

<u>Castro</u>

Cast on 35 stitches (multiple of 10 sts + 5). Setup row: K1 [P5, K5], P4 Main row: K1 [P5, K5], P3, S1WYIF

Dogpatch

Cast on 33 stitches (multiple of 10 sts + 3). Setup row: [K4, P4, K1, P1], K3 Main row: [K4, P4, K1, P1], K2, S1WYIF

Tenderloin Cast on 35 (multiple of 10 sts + 5). Setup row: [K5, P5], K5 Main row: [K5, P5], K4, S1WYIF
